Chapels

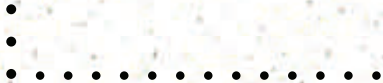
The students will

Language Arts

English and Grammar

Your child will increase their thinking skills, improve their reading comprehension, and develop their creative writing ability. By the end of the year, your first grader will be able to:

- ◆ Write in complete sentences
- ◆ Capitalize the first word of a sentence and of the days and months
- ◆ Place a period at the end of a sentence
- ◆ Know the suffixes and prefixes
- ◆ Alphabetize words

Spelling

This program was designed as a fast-paced, comprehensive skills-teaching system that is arranged phonetically. Students will see how phonics, spelling, composition, vocabulary, penmanship, reading, and grammar go hand-in-hand as tools for the effective use of God's gift of language.

Handwriting

Students will continue to work towards mastery of manuscript writing.

Reading/Phonics

An intensive phonics approach is taught systematically throughout the school year to ensure continued growth in skills. This combined with the other components of our Language Arts program increases reading comprehension and refines thinking skills. Each student is exposed to short stories and poetry that are designed to build confidence and enthusiasm in reading, while introducing them to fun-filled, character-building stories.

Mathematics

First Grade Math will present concepts in an orderly manner, building on prior learning and including consistent year-long review.

Concepts include:

- ◆ Counting
- ◆ Writing and reading numbers
- ◆ Place value
- ◆ Addition and subtraction
- ◆ Money
- ◆ Graphs
- ◆ Measurement
- ◆ Time and temperature
- ◆ Fractions

Application to real world situations and daily thinking skills stretch students thinking abilities.

Social Studies

- ◆ Students will learn how our country was founded and what our basic freedoms are.
- ◆ They will meet several famous American patriots and take a trip across America.
- ◆ Good citizenship is emphasized.
- ◆ Reading skills are developed.
- ◆ Patriotic songs are included.
- ◆ Your students will also be introduced to Geography while learning about major countries and U.S. Territories.

Science

First Grade Science will present God as the Master and Designer of the world around us.

The studies of:

provide an excellent introduction to science, with the emphasis is on building student interest and augmenting students' reading skills. Hands on activities help to increase comprehension of basic science concepts.
